\$5b to build Melbourne Airport Rail Link

Traffic congestion and crowded public transport reduce our standard of living and are a drain on our economy.

That is why I am thrilled that the Turnbull Government's 2018 Budget includes a \$7.8 billion package for new roads and rail across Victoria, including \$5 billion to build the Melbourne Airport Rail Link.

The Airport Rail Link will bust congestion, slash travel times,

boost productivity and create thousands of jobs.

Melbourne will finally be in the same league as other major international cities like New York, London and Sydney.

I was proud to advocate strongly for this project and I am delighted that it will now become a reality.

Other highlights of the package include funding to connect Monash University's Caulfield and Clayton campuses, and a

Victorian Congestion Package.

This record investment in transport infrastructure will enhance both the liveability of our city and the productivity of our state for the benefit of all Victorians.

This announcement brings the total amount of Australian Government funding available for Victorian infrastructure to 23.8 per cent.

Budget 2018



Budget 2018 outlines our plan to deliver a stronger economy.

Lower, fairer, simpler taxes

The Turnbull Government has announced a plan to make income tax lower, fairer and simpler, so Australians keep more of their money.

Stage one will deliver tax relief to low and middle income earners, with 10 million taxpayers standing to benefit next financial year. By completion, our plan will provide lower taxes for all taxpayers, ensuring 94 per cent of taxpayers pay no more than 32.5 cents in the dollar.

We are also ensuring the Government lives within its means. The Budget is forecast to return to a modest balance of \$2.2 billion in 2019-20 and increase to a projected surplus of \$11 billion the following year.

The Parliament can lock in our tax plan with one vote in the House of Representatives and one vote in the Senate, which will deliver certainty for the next seven years. **Visit the Tax Relief Calculator at www.budget.gov.au to find out how you will benefit.**

Supporting older Australians

The Turnbull Government is supporting older Australians to live longer, happier, healthier lives.

The Pension Loans Scheme will be opened to all older Australians to boost their retirement income by up to \$17,800 for a couple. We are also expanding the Pension Work Bonus.

An additional 14,000 high level home care packages will help more people stay in their own homes for longer. And we are providing an additional 13,500 residential places for those who are not able to stay at home.

Protecting the Great Barrier Reef

The Great Barrier Reef is the world's largest living structure and a national treasure.

The Turnbull Government's 2018 Budget includes further support to secure the reef's future.

The health of the Great Barrier Reef will benefit from \$535.8 million over five years from 2017-18.

This investment accelerates the delivery of the \$2 billion joint Australian and Queensland Government Reef 2050 Plan.

Our plan for a stronger economy



The Turnbull Government is cracking down on the black economy, including new measures to strike at the illicit tobacco market.

Tackling the black economy

Honest businesses and taxpayers are being ripped off by those who think they are above paying tax.

That is why the Turnbull Government is taking decisive action in the fight against the black economy, which is often used by organised crime syndicates.

We are banning cash payments to businesses above \$10,000, which will stop cash purchases of housing and we are cracking down on illicit tobacco. Our black economy measures are expected to bring in around \$5.3 billion over the next four years.

Protecting your super

The Turnbull Government is introducing new measures to protect Australians' superannuation savings.

For the first time, we will automatically reunite Australians with their lost super through the ATO, ensuring it isn't eaten up in ongoing fees.

This new system is expected to reunite Australians with \$6 billion of lost savings in 2019-20 alone.

We are also banning exit fees on superannuation accounts for when you want to change funds.

Additionally, we will stop superannuation funds from forcing young people under 25 or with low balances to pay for life insurance policies they do not want or need.

Delivering record and growing public hospital funding

The Turnbull Government is guaranteeing the essential services Australians rely on such as Medicare, hospitals and mental health.

A new five-year fully funded hospital agreement will deliver record public hospital funding, including an additional \$30 billion over five years.

\$338 million in new mental health funding will focus on suicide prevention, research and older Australians. Lifeline will receive extra funding to help them answer more calls and provide vital support for more people.



Budget 2018 includes an extra \$34 million for Lifeline.

Fighting for our community

A new mobile CCTV camera will help keep our community safe.



Mobile CCTV camera delivered

High-profile armed robberies, home invasions and carjackings have caused concern in our community in recent years.

That is why I am pleased to have secured Australian Government funding for a new mobile CCTV camera.

A first for Victoria, the trailer-mounted camera can

be deployed where it is most needed to help protect our community.

I thank Stonnington Council and Malvern Police for their work on this innovative crime-fighting tool.

This initiative follows funding I have previously secured for CCTV cameras in Prahran, South Yarra, Carnegie and Ashburton. While

law and order is predominantly a State Government issue, the Turnbull Government is committed to doing everything within the Federal Government's powers to fight crime.

We are also working to protect Australians from the threat of terrorism, with \$294 million to expand security at our airports.

Support for the Victorian Pride Centre

As the Minister responsible, I was delighted to announce that the Federal Budget has enabled donations to the Victorian Pride Centre to be tax deductible.

I was pleased to advocate strongly for this within the Government. The Centre will bring together LGBTI organisations and support services under one roof.

An exhibition space will ensure the Centre is visited by the wider community, helping to break down barriers.
